The Susan Polgar Institute for Chess Excellence (SPICE) at Webster University welcomes all undergraduate students to apply for a SPICE Chess Scholarship for the 2020-2021 academic year. To be awarded, applicants must have an over-the-board tournament play USCF and/or FIDE rating that is less than two years old. Applicants must meet Webster University general admission requirements. Applications are reviewed by the SPICE Scholarship Committee.

Who should apply?

Students who are interested in competing in local, national, and international chess tournaments should apply. Students who are interested in promoting and supporting scholastic chess and other chess-related community service work should also apply.

Chess Excellence Scholarships

The Chess Excellence scholarship may include partial or full tuition, fees, room, and/or board for undergraduate students. The application deadline is the Friday before classes begin for the term for which you are applying.

Renewing awards

SPICE scholarships acknowledge student chess and academic accomplishments, such as superior tournament play, excellent scholastic chess community service, and outstanding academic record. Scholarships are renewable up to the completion of 128 undergraduate credit hours. Renewals by application are conditional upon playing in local, regional, state, and/or national-level tournaments as determined by the SPICE scholarship committee; sufficient local scholastic chess community service as determined by the SPICE scholarship committee; and/or good academic standing as determined by Webster University.

To be eligible for SPICE Scholarship funds, the student's home campus must be the St. Louis Home Campus in Webster Groves.

Application requirements

All completed applications must include:

1. A completed questionnaire
2. Two letters of support (one academic; one chess-related)

Even though you may not receive or qualify for any of the scholarships above you may still be able to receive support through our other chess activities such as workshops, summer chess camps, teaching in local schools, and Super Saturdays.
